## **“10 Steps to Help You Discover God’s Will”**

1. **What insights or observations do you have from the idea that Scott shared of "God's will" with a lowercase "w."**

(In case you've forgotten what it is Scott said: "There are things God wants to happens, but is NOT going to force to happen.")

2. **What insights or observations do you have from the idea that Scott shared of "God's will" with an uppercase "W"?**

(In case you've forgotten what it is Scott said: "There are thing God PLANS to happen and there is nothing on earth or in hell that can stop it.")

3. **What did you think of Scott's opinion when he said, "1. If you are seeking God's will, then I don't believe you can miss his ULTIMATE will for your life.**

**I'm NOT saying you won't miss out on things you could've done, some places you could have went, some things you could've had. You WILL! But I don't think you will miss out on God's ultimate plan for your life IF you're seeking God and wanting to DO what he wants you to do."**

(Scott used the example of Abraham lying. Even though it wasn't God's will for Abraham to lie, God still used it as a part of his plan for Abraham.)

**Do you agree with this idea? If so, what Bible passages or stories can you think of that confirm this idea?**

**If you disagree, what Bible passages or stories can you think of that disprove this idea?**

4. **How was Scott's story of the two hikers on the trail the split, but didn't have a sign clarifying which path to take, help you?**

(Scott said, "When you seek God's specific will for your life, SOMETIMES He will make the choice clear ONLY when it makes a difference. Sometimes – not all times – sometimes, either of two choices will get you to the same place!"

5. **Out of the 10 steps that Scott shared which one really resonated with you, because you've seen it's truth in your own life**

6. **Out of the 10 steps that Scott shared which one was a new insight for you? How was it helpful for you?**
